

Product Review for Vector Optics Continental 2-12x50 Scope

General Overview

I shot my 375 Ruger at 100 yards and 3 shots made one cloverleaf hole, very good. I also shot it at both low power and high power and the point of impact did not change, so I am happy to use it for an upcoming Elk hunt in a few weeks.

The positive click adjustments are precise, wide field of view and no dark ring around the edge, the reticle was easier to see and just right with illuminated center dot a big plus, it's better than many \$1,000 to 1,200.00 scopes I have used.



The Adjustment

The capped adjustment is good for general hunting and most big game hunting. Total 140 MOA of adjustment with Low profile turrets. So they don't snag on anything and they don't get turned accidentally.

I would need to guess on how high to hold over or I could turn the turret up 24 clicks and hold dead on. So when I go on this Elk hunt in a few weeks I could get a shot anywhere from 100 to 400 yards, so I'll leave the top cap off so I can dial in the elevation if needed.

The Optics

The scope is wonderful, great field of view and extremely clear and sharp on the target with very little distortion, eye relief is great at all magnifications. The light transmission reaches around 90% or better. The eye box is also wonderful and very forgiving.

Many deer hunters shoot at very low light. Many animals are only in the open at first light and at sun set. In the US we can shoot until 30 minutes after sunset but in Europe they can shoot on moon lite nights very late. The Continental scope will give you a decent image at that time. You will truly appreciate your investment for Vector Optics Top Line Scope.



BAD News for Big Bull Elk
